A Visit to the Garden

- ① On Saturday, Maya visited the community garden with her class. A gardener showed the group tiny seeds and green sprouts. He carefully placed a bean seed in soft soil. Maya watched closely as he covered it. The gardener explained that roots grow below the ground, while stems and leaves reach toward sunlight. Plants need rain and air, too.
- ② The class worked cheerfully at each garden bed. A helper carried a watering can, and a second helper pulled weeds. Maya felt hopeful when she saw a ladybug on a leaf. The helpful gardener said ladybugs eat many plant pests. Everyone was thankful for the small insect's work. They gently looked for more ladybugs before leaving.
- ③ Afterward, Maya wrote a short note for the school news page. She described the garden as colorful and peaceful. She also wrote that the helpers moved quickly but handled each seed gently. Her note shared the garden's beauty and thanked the gardener for teaching the class. The class planned a return visit in spring to see new growth.

4	In paragraph 3, compare quickly and gardener. Which word is an adverb, and which word names a person?	Quickly is an adverb that tells how the helpers moved. Gardener is a noun that names a person.
