Builders of the Pond

- ① Beavers are busy builders that live near ponds, streams, and rivers. Their wide, flat tails help them swim and balance on land. A beaver uses its sharp front teeth to gnaw, or chew, through wood. It carries branches to the water and piles them together. The growing pile can slow the water and form a deep pond.
- ② In the pond, a beaver may build a lodge, a home made of sticks and mud. The entrance is often underwater, which helps protect the beaver from some predators. Beavers spread oil through their fur to make it waterproof. Waterproof means that water cannot soak through it. This oily coat also helps the animal stay warm while it swims.
- ③ Beavers are nocturnal, so they usually sleep during the day and are active at night. They often become active around dusk, when daylight fades. A beaver must inspect its dam, or look at it carefully, after heavy rain. If fast water makes a hole, the beaver brings mud and branches to repair it. By changing water flow, beavers can create habitat for many other living things.
