Robin at the Nature Center

- ① On Saturday, Maya carried a small box to the park. Inside, a young robin shivered beneath a soft towel. The bird had bumped into her window and could not fly well. Maya did not rush. She stepped quietly along the path, holding the box level so the robin would not slide during the short trip.
- ② At the nature center, Ms. Lee examined the robin. “Its wing is sore, but no bone is broken,” she explained. She placed the bird in a warm, dark crate. The robin pecked at tiny mealworms and sipped water from a shallow dish. By afternoon, it hopped from one perch to another with more strength each time.
- ③ Two days later, Ms. Lee carried the crate outside. Maya watched as the robin fluttered to a low branch. It paused, then soared over the grass and into a maple tree. The bird settled on a sturdy limb and gave a clear chirp. Maya smiled. The robin had chosen a safe, high place to rest.

4	Why is soared a more precise word than flew in paragraph 3?	It shows that the robin flew high through the air, not simply that it flew.
