### Maple Park Plan

- ① **HELP OUR PARK STAY CLEAN!** Pack a snack? Pack your trash, too. After you eat at Maple Park, put wrappers, cups, and peels in a trash can. If a bin is full, take your trash home. Clean paths and grassy spots are safer for people, pets, and park animals. Everyone can help during every visit there.
- ② **BRING A FRIEND ON SATURDAY, MAY 9, 10:00-11:00 A.M.** Meet beside the red playground slide. Gloves and trash bags will be ready for you. Park workers will sort the collected trash after the cleanup. Wear closed-toe shoes, and ask an adult before you come. The hour will end with a count of the bags we filled.
- ③ **WHY DOES THIS MATTER?** Litter can blow into storm drains and travel to streams. Animals may mistake small pieces of trash for food. A clean park also gives families a pleasant place to walk, play, and rest. Put the date on your calendar. Then bring your helping hands to Maple Park, because small actions can make a shared place better.
