A Class Bird Day

- ① Ms. Lin's class planned a Bird Day for the school. Their shared goal was to teach younger students how to help birds find food, water, and safe places to rest. First, the class made a list of jobs. Tori and Malik researched local birds in library books. June and Evan drew signs. Other classmates gathered clean pinecones and string for a feeder craft.
- ② During work time, the teams checked in with one another. Malik found that the library books did not show a picture of a robin nest, so he asked June's team for help. June suggested leaving a blank box on the sign until Malik could find a photo. The class also decided to use the same three colors on every sign, so the Bird Day display would look connected.
- ③ On Friday, each team put its work in the gym. Tori read the bird facts aloud while Evan showed children how to make the feeder craft. When a string supply ran low, Evan told the class. Two students brought extra string from the art shelf, and the craft table stayed open. At the end, Ms. Lin asked what helped the project succeed. The class named clear jobs, helpful ideas, and solving problems together to meet its goal.
