Maya's Monarch Talk

- ① Maya stood beside a poster about monarch butterflies at the school nature fair. “Monarchs travel long distances each fall,” she told the visitors. Eli raised his hand. “Where do they go?” Maya answered, “Many monarchs from the eastern United States fly to mountain forests in Mexico.” She paused and looked around. “What else would you like to know?”
- ② Jada pointed to a picture of a caterpillar. “How does a monarch begin its life?” she asked. Maya said, “A monarch begins as an egg on a milkweed plant. The egg hatches into a caterpillar.” Mr. Chen, a visitor, asked, “Why is milkweed important?” Maya replied, “Monarch caterpillars eat milkweed, so the plants give them food.”
- ③ Before the talk ended, Maya asked the group, “Can anyone name one way to help monarchs?” Rosa answered, “We can plant milkweed and other flowers.” Maya responded, “Yes, those plants can provide food.” Then Sam asked, “Are monarchs the same as butterflies that stay here all winter?” Maya said, “No. Many monarchs migrate, while some other butterflies do not travel as far.”

3	How did Maya invite the visitors to ask more questions after she answered Eli?	She asked, "What else would you like to know?"
4	What did Sam ask Maya? How did Maya answer?	Sam asked whether monarchs are the same as butterflies that stay all winter. Maya said no, many monarchs migrate, while some other butterflies do not travel as far.
