The Gettysburg Address

- ① In 1863, President Abraham Lincoln gave the Gettysburg Address at a cemetery in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. The Civil War was being fought, and many soldiers had died nearby. Lincoln's speech honored the dead and reminded people why the United States mattered. It was brief, but its ideas about equality, freedom, and self-government have been remembered for more than 160 years.
- ② Near the end, Lincoln spoke these words: “that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom, and that government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth.” The line names a hope for freedom and explains that the people should have a voice in their government.
- ③ Lincoln's ending is often recited because it is memorable. Its ideas build to a powerful ending. When people say it aloud, they can use pauses to help listeners hear each part. Reciting a small section can connect you to a speech from the past. It can also help you share its important message with others.
