The Writing Circle

- ① On Tuesday, Ms. Lee’s class met in writing circles. Before anyone read, the group chose three norms: take turns, look at the speaker, and use kind, helpful words. Maya placed a smooth stone in the center. Whoever held the stone could share. The others kept their pencils down and listened until the writer finished reading.
- ② Jamal read his paragraph about a lost puppy. When he finished, Rosa said, “I could picture the puppy hiding under the porch. Could you add why it was scared?” Jamal wrote Rosa’s idea on a sticky note. He answered, “I can add that the puppy heard thunder.” Rosa nodded and said, “That will help readers understand.”
- ③ Next, Theo shared a story about building a cardboard robot with his grandfather. Eli waited until Theo was done, then gave feedback. “Your first sentence makes me want to read more,” Eli said. “I was confused about how the robot moved. Can you explain that part?” Theo replied, “Yes. I will add that we used rubber bands.” He thanked Eli and revised his story.
