Leo's Bridge Notebook

- ① On Tuesday, Leo went to the school library with a question in mind: Which book will help me learn about building bridges? He looked at the labels, chose a book about famous bridges, and read the first two pages. The book had photographs, captions, and a glossary. Leo decided it was a good match because he could understand most of the words and wanted to know more.
- ② At home, Leo reached a hard word, suspension, in a sentence about a bridge. First, he reread the sentence and studied the picture. Then he used the glossary. He wrote the word and its meaning in his notebook. When his younger sister asked what he was doing, Leo said, "I am figuring it out step by step before I ask for help."
- ③ After reading, Leo made a page for his bridge notebook. He chose to draw a labeled sketch of a suspension bridge and add three facts from the book. Next, he reread his sentences, checked that each fact matched the book, and changed one unclear sentence. He placed the finished page in his folder. Leo planned to show it to his teacher during writing time.
