Jayden's Garden Flyer

- ① Jayden wanted to write a flyer about the school garden workday. Before he wrote, he chose his purpose: to invite families to help plant vegetables on Saturday. He decided that his goal was to have at least ten helpers. Jayden knew that families needed clear details, so he planned to include the date, time, place, and jobs people could do.
- ② Jayden pictured busy parents and younger brothers and sisters reading the flyer. He used short sentences and friendly words so families could understand it quickly. He wrote, "Bring gloves if you have them," instead of using hard gardening words. He also added a small map of the garden because some families might not know where it was.
- ③ After checking his work, Jayden read the flyer as if he were a parent. He noticed that the first line said exactly what readers were invited to do. The last line told them how to sign up. Jayden believed the flyer could meet his goal because it gave families a reason to come and the information they needed.
