Ask an adult at home to check for extra packets first. You may also bring a small hand trowel or garden gloves to share.
- ③ Your gifts will help us plant on April 2, when the weather is warmer. The notice includes dates, a drop-off spot, and a list of useful items, so families can know how to help. If many families join in, our garden will have more kinds of plants for everyone to enjoy during recess and class visits.
