Why Milkweed Matters

- ① When Maya noticed fewer butterflies near her school garden, she made a research question: Why do monarch butterflies need milkweed? She did not guess. First, she looked at a book from the public library about insects. The book said monarch caterpillars eat milkweed leaves. Maya wrote the book title and page number in her notes so she could check the information later.
- ② Next, Maya used a webpage from the National Park Service, a United States government agency. The page explained that adult monarchs lay eggs on milkweed plants. When the eggs hatch, the caterpillars have the food they need nearby. Maya compared this idea with her library book. Both sources gave information about milkweed, so Maya felt more sure that the information was accurate.
- ③ Maya answered her question in a short report. She wrote, "Monarchs need milkweed because their caterpillars eat its leaves, and adults lay eggs on the plants." Then she listed her two sources. Her report included facts that answered her question, not extra facts about butterfly colors or wings. Careful researchers use reliable sources, compare information, and share only relevant facts.
