Peregrine Falcons in the City

- ① Each spring, a pair of peregrine falcons may nest on a tall building in a city. A building ledge can feel like the high cliffs where these birds nest in nature. The adults build a small scrape, or shallow dip, instead of a large twig nest. From the ledge, they can watch the streets and sky below.
- ② Peregrine falcons are known for fast dives called stoops. When hunting, a falcon may fly high, fold its wings, and dive toward another bird. Its body shape and pointed wings help it move quickly through the air. Peregrines often eat birds, such as pigeons and starlings, which can be found in many cities and towns.
- ③ Some building owners place nest boxes on high rooftops. A nest box gives the birds a protected spot to lay eggs and raise young. Wildlife workers may watch the nests from a distance and record what they see. These careful checks can help people learn whether young falcons are growing well from year to year.
