Seed Jar Watch

- ① Want to watch a bean seed wake up? This guide helps young gardeners grow a bean in a clear jar. You can see the roots and stem without digging up the plant. Read each part before you begin. Ask an adult for help with scissors, and keep your jar near a sunny window at home or school.
- ② **Materials:** You need a clear jar, a paper towel, three dried beans, water, and a small piece of tape. Write your name and the date on the tape. Wet the paper towel, squeeze out extra water, and press it around the inside of the jar. Slide the beans between the towel and the glass so you can see them.
- ③ **Daily Check:** Each day, look through the glass and write one change in a notebook. If the towel feels dry, add a few drops of water. Do not fill the jar with water, because the beans need air too. After several days, you may spot a tiny root. When a stem grows, move the bean to soil.
