Bees in the Garden

- ① At the school garden, Mia watched honeybees visit the flowers. A bee moved from blossom to blossom like a tiny mail carrier, picking up pollen. The pollen stuck to fuzzy hairs on its body. When the bee landed on another flower of the same kind, some pollen rubbed off. This helps many plants make seeds.
- ② Bees visit flowers in the garden. Flowers offer nectar and pollen. Nectar is a sweet liquid that bees drink. Pollen gives bees protein. The garden was a colorful cafeteria for the bees, with many kinds of flowers to choose from. If one kind of flower has little nectar, bees can then visit another kind nearby.
- ③ On a warm morning, the bees got down to business. They flew between flowers and carried pollen as they searched for food. Later, Mia saw small green pods on bean plants. The bees had helped the plants make seeds, so the garden could grow more beans. For Mia, the busy bees were a bridge between bright flowers and her snack.
