A Kite Contest Choice

- ① On Saturday, Lena carried a blue ribbon to the park for the kite contest. At the gate, she saw Omar searching the grass with wet eyes. His little sister had tied the ribbon to her kite, but the wind had pulled it away. Lena wanted to race inside because the contest would begin soon. Still, she stopped and asked where Omar had looked.
- ② Lena remembered that the contest prize was a paint set she hoped to win. She took off her shoes and walked slowly along the muddy edge of the pond. Omar checked the bushes nearby. When Lena spotted blue cloth caught on a branch, she felt relieved. She handed the ribbon to Omar, even though mud covered her socks and the starting bell rang.
- ③ Omar's sister hugged Lena and said, "You missed your contest chance because of us." Lena watched Omar tie the ribbon to the kite. Then she smiled and helped them lift it into the wind. The kite rose high above the trees. Lena did not win a paint set that day, but she learned that helping someone can matter more than getting a prize.
