A Bean Seed Wakes Up

- ① Before a bean seed can grow, it needs water, air, and warmth. Water softens the seed coat, the hard outside covering. Then water enters the seed. The tiny plant inside, called an embryo, begins using food stored in the seed. This first change matters because the embryo needs energy before it can push out new parts.
- ② Next, a small root breaks through the seed coat and grows downward. The root takes in water and helps hold the young plant in the soil. After the root starts working, a shoot grows upward. This order helps the plant. It gets water through its root before its leaves must work above the ground in sunlight.
- ③ Finally, leaves open on the shoot. In sunlight, the leaves use water and a gas called carbon dioxide from the air to make food for the plant. This food lets the plant grow taller and make more leaves. The events are connected: water starts the seed growing, roots bring in more water, and leaves make food after they open above the soil.
