A Covered Bike Rack

- ① Our school should add a covered bike rack near the front gate. A roof over the rack would keep bikes dry on rainy days. It would also make biking to school feel easier for families. I think more students would choose bikes when they know their seats and backpacks will stay dry during the school day.
- ② Last Tuesday, I counted twelve bikes locked to the small rack before classes began. Three bikes were leaned against a fence because the rack was full. This count shows that students already use bikes to get to school. A covered rack with more spaces could give every bike a safe place near the gate too.
- ③ Some people may worry that a covered rack would cost too much. My answer is to begin with a small roof over the rack we have now. The school could ask local hardware stores to donate materials for the project. Starting small makes the plan more realistic and still protects bikes from rain on wet days.
