Maya's Butterfly Garden Visit

- ① On a sunny September morning, Maya visited a butterfly garden with her uncle. A small cursive sign near the gate read, "Please walk slowly." Maya noticed orange and black monarch butterflies resting on purple flowers. Her uncle explained that the garden gives butterflies nectar, a sweet liquid from flowers. Maya kept her eyes open for other helpful signs.
- ② Beside a wooden bench, Maya found another sign written in looping cursive. It said, "Monarchs travel south when autumn grows cool." She had seen maps of this trip in class, but reading the sign helped her connect the map to the garden. A volunteer named Mr. Chen said that some monarchs travel thousands of miles to reach warmer places.
- ③ Before leaving, Maya read a final cursive card by a milkweed plant. The card said, "Milkweed is the only food monarch caterpillars eat." Maya drew the plant in her notebook and wrote its name in print. At home, she told her brother that gardens can help monarchs during different parts of their lives. He asked to visit the garden next weekend.
