Following the Monarchs

- ① Each fall, monarch butterflies begin a long trip from parts of the United States and Canada to mountain forests in central Mexico. The butterflies cannot make the whole return trip alone. Several generations travel north in spring. In Mexico, they rest in oyamel fir trees, where the forest helps protect them from cold weather and wind.
- ② Scientists tag some monarchs with tiny stickers that carry a code. When a person finds a tagged butterfly, the code can show where it traveled. People also count butterflies at resting places. These records help scientists learn whether the population is changing. A smaller population can mean that butterflies need safer places to feed and rest.
- ③ During a visit to the garden, Jordan noticed a monarch resting on purple asters. He wrote the date in a notebook and told Ms. Chen. The class watched from a distance so the butterfly could drink nectar. Later, Jordan checked a map to see which direction monarchs might travel. His careful note became part of the class garden record.
