Helping Sea Turtles

- ① At a coastal rescue center, workers care for injured sea turtles. A turtle may arrive with a cut from fishing line or a weak flipper. The team keeps each turtle in a clean tank and checks its health. When the animal can swim, eat, and breathe well, workers prepare it to return to open water.
- ② Before a release, a keeper reads the weather report and watches the tide. Strong waves can break against rocks near the beach. A great deal of planning keeps the trip safe. The keeper carries the turtle in a padded crate, so its head stays safe. At the water's edge, the turtle is placed on wet sand. Then it heads toward the sea and swims away.
- ③ The team records the date, the turtle's weight, and any treatment it needed. These notes help scientists learn which dangers affect turtles most often. For example, a plastic bag can look like a jellyfish, a food many sea turtles eat. By keeping beaches clean and leaving wildlife alone, people can help more turtles reach healthy waters.
