COMMAS CORRECT

1	No, I cannot stay late.	CORRECT	A comma follows No at the beginning of the sentence.
2	Maya please close the gate.	FIX	A comma is needed after Maya because Maya is being spoken to directly.
3	Yes, Grandpa, the soup is ready.	CORRECT	A comma follows Yes, and commas set off Grandpa as direct address.
4	Will you help me, partner?	CORRECT	A comma sets off partner, the word used to speak directly to someone.
5	No we did not see the comet.	FIX	A comma is needed after No.
6	Captain, steer toward the island.	CORRECT	A comma follows Captain, which is direct address.
7	I agree teammate.	FIX	A comma is needed before teammate, which is direct address.
8	Yes we can begin now, friends.	FIX	A comma is needed after Yes. Friends is correctly set off as direct address.

- **CORRECT:** Uncle Ray, I found the keys.
