5	Ran quickly toward the finish line.	FRAGMENT	It has a verb, ran, but does not name who ran.
6	After the last bell rang.	FRAGMENT	It begins with after and leaves the reader waiting to learn what happened next.
7	Bright stars sparkled above the campsite.	SENTENCE	It has a subject, stars, and a verb, sparkled, and expresses a complete thought.
8	In the basket near the door.	FRAGMENT	It tells where, but it does not tell what happened.
