ADJECTIVE JOB

An adjective tells what kind of person, place, thing, or idea. The suffix -ful can make a root word into an adjective, often meaning full of the root idea.

The playful puppy chased a ball.

ADVERB JOB

An adverb tells how an action happens. Adding -ly can make an adjective into an adverb, meaning in that way.

The puppy chased the ball playfully.

3	The pianist played skillfully.	ADVERB	Skillfully tells how the pianist played, so it is an adverb.
4	The thankful class wrote notes.	ADJECTIVE	Thankful describes the class, so it is an adjective.
5	The mayor spoke thoughtfully.	ADVERB	Thoughtfully tells how the mayor spoke, so it is an adverb.
6	The reporter answered truthfully.	ADVERB	Truthfully tells how the reporter answered, so it is an adverb.
7	The peaceful lake reflected the trees.	ADJECTIVE	Peaceful describes the lake, so it is an adjective.
8	The coach spoke patiently.	ADVERB	Patiently tells how the coach spoke, so it is an adverb.

PART 3 • MAKE YOUR OWN (SAMPLE ANSWERS)

- **ADJECTIVE:** The graceful dancer bowed.
- **ADVERB:** The dancer bowed gracefully.

Challenge: The cheerful crowd clapped. The crowd clapped cheerfully. Cheerful describes the crowd, and cheerfully tells how the crowd clapped.

For Part 2, accept explanations that correctly identify the word's job in its sentence. Students should state that an adjective describes a noun and an adverb tells how an action happens.
