A Guide for the City Park

- ① At the city park, a new trail guide helps visitors explore without harming habitats. The guide shows a wetland path, where frogs rest among reeds, and a rocky route near a small stream. Symbols on the map identify places to refill water, watch birds, or use a restroom. Each symbol gives clear information quickly, even to a visitor who does not know the park.
- ② Before walking, families can borrow a portable audio player at the nature center. Its small size lets a visitor carry it in a backpack from one stop to the next. A rechargeable battery powers it. After the battery loses energy, staff members connect it to electricity, and it works again. This prevents piles of single-use batteries from being thrown away.
- ③ Rangers ask visitors to report problems with exact details. Instead of saying, "There is trash by the trail," a visitor might say, "Three plastic bottles are beside the bridge on the wetland path." The second report helps a ranger locate the litter without searching the whole park. Careful word choices can make a message more useful when people need to act.

Two reusable cups are under the bench beside the bird-watching sign. Reusable means able to be used again, and the suffix -able helps show that meaning.
