Low-Tide Discoveries

- ① At low tide, Ranger Maya led a group of students across the rocky shore. In a shallow pool, they saw a cluster of mussels, or a group growing close together. Maya explained that mussels use strong threads to hold on when waves crash. The animals stayed packed tightly along the rock, where the water was cold and clear.
- ② Nearby, a sea star moved slowly over the wet stone. It used tube feet, tiny soft parts on its underside, to grip the rock. Grip means to hold something firmly so it does not slip away. When a small crab passed by, the sea star curled its arms around it and began to eat its meal.
- ③ Maya pointed to a narrow channel where water rushed back to the ocean. “Watch the current,” she said, meaning the moving water. Then she checked a current chart, a chart with the newest tide times. The word current has more than one meaning. By using nearby words, the students knew which meaning fit each sentence.

1	What does cluster mean in the first paragraph? Which words help you know?	Cluster means a group growing close together. The clue is "or a group growing close together."
2	What are tube feet? Use details from the passage to explain.	Tube feet are tiny, soft parts on a sea star's underside that help it move and hold on.
3	What does grip mean in the second paragraph?	Grip means to hold something firmly so it does not slip away.
4	What does current mean when Maya checks a current chart? What nearby words give the clue?	Current means newest or most up-to-date. The clue is "a chart with the newest tide times."

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)
