## CAREFUL ADVERBS

Careful adverbs show attention to doing a task well, neatly, or correctly. They focus on the work itself.

Jorge accurately copied the address onto the envelope.

## CAUTIOUS ADVERBS

Cautious adverbs show extra care because something could go wrong or be unsafe. They focus on avoiding a problem.

Caleb alertly watched the dark trail for bears.

Accept other adverbs when the sentence clearly shows attention to doing work well or extra care to avoid danger. Ask students to use the context as well as the adverb when explaining their choices.
