Maya's Pond Notes

- ① At sunrise, Maya walked to the pond behind the nature center. A great blue heron stood in the shallow water, nearly as still as a statue. Its long, pointed bill faced the reeds. Maya did not write that the bird was “big.” She described its tall body, wide wings, and slow, careful steps. Those details helped readers picture the heron clearly.
- ② Soon, the heron lifted one foot and placed it silently into the mud. A small fish flickered near the surface. The bird did not rush. It froze, then jabbed its bill into the water and caught the fish. In her notes, Maya chose the verb jabbed instead of hit. Jabbed showed a quick, sharp movement. She chose flickered instead of moved because the fish made a brief flash of light. Precise verbs told what happened.
- ③ Maya also listened to the pond. The water lapped softly against the bank, and dragonflies hovered above the lilies. She wrote that the air was cool, not just nice. Cool told about temperature, while nice did not give readers much information. By choosing exact words, Maya made her field notes clearer and more useful for a science report.
