Garden Sign Team

- ① Ms. Chen's class planned a shared project: make signs for the school garden. At their first meeting, the group chose one goal. By Friday, they wanted clear, colorful signs that taught visitors how to protect the plants. Everyone agreed that the signs should be easy for younger students to read. The group wrote the goal at the top of its planning page.
- ② Next, the students made group norms. They decided to listen while one person spoke, use kind words, and ask before changing another person's drawing. They also chose jobs: Maya would collect facts about garden rules, Eli would sketch pictures, and Jordan would check spelling. The group planned to meet for ten minutes each day, share progress, and place finished work in a folder.
- ③ On Wednesday, Eli was absent, so the group could not finish the pictures. Jordan suggested that each person work alone on a different sign, but Maya reminded the group to check in first. They followed their procedure, shared what was done, and chose a new plan. Maya gathered facts, Jordan began two simple sketches, and Eli would add details when he returned. The group still aimed to finish by Friday.

2	Which group norm would stop a student from changing a partner's drawing without permission? Explain how it helps.	Ask before changing another person's drawing. It helps group members respect each other's work.
3	What three things did the group plan to do as part of its daily procedure?	Meet for ten minutes, share progress, and place finished work in a folder.
4	How did the group use its procedure and change jobs when Eli was absent?	They checked in, shared what was done, and chose a new plan. Maya gathered facts, Jordan started sketches, and Eli would add details later.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

Our goal is to make a welcome poster for new students by Thursday. Our norms are to listen without interrupting and to ask before changing a partner's work. Nia will write the message, Sam will draw pictures, and Leo will check spelling. Each day, we will meet for ten minutes, share progress, and put our work in one folder. If Sam is absent, Nia and Leo will check in and choose a new plan. Leo can sketch a border, and Sam can add pictures when he returns.

Accept equivalent wording that accurately identifies the goal, norms, procedures, and changed plan from the passage. For the open task, accept varied projects if the response includes all required planning parts and a workable response to an absence.
