- ① At the school nature fair, Nia gave a short talk about monarch butterflies. She showed a map of their long migration and explained that they need nectar from flowers. Then she looked at the audience and said, “What questions do you have?” Marcus raised his hand. “How do monarchs know where to go?” he asked.
- ② Nia paused so she could answer carefully. “Scientists think monarchs use the sun, Earth’s magnetic field, and clues in the landscape,” she said. “They do not learn one exact route from their parents.” Another listener asked, “Can we help them?” Nia replied, “Yes. Planting native flowers can give monarchs food during their journey in spring and fall.”
- ③ Before the next question, Nia invited the group to share ideas. “What native flower could we plant near our school?” she asked. Lila answered, “Milkweed is important because monarch caterpillars eat its leaves.” Nia said, “Thank you, Lila. That is a useful idea.” She added, “Does anyone have another question about helping monarchs?” The audience had more to discuss.
