Seed Bank Backup

- ① What Is a Seed Bank? A seed bank is a place where people store seeds from many kinds of plants. Some banks keep seeds from crops, such as beans and rice. Others collect seeds from wild plants. These collections can protect plant variety when habitats change, storms strike, or a plant becomes hard to find.
- ② Keeping Seeds Safe Seeds must stay dry and cold so they can last for many years. Workers clean the seeds, place them in sealed containers, and label each container. The labels record the plant's name, where it grew, and the date the seeds were collected. Freezers slow the seeds' use of stored food.
- ③ Using the Collection When a community needs seeds, scientists can send samples from a seed bank. Farmers may use them to grow crops after drought or disease harms local plants. Researchers also study stored seeds to learn which plants can survive in certain conditions. Seed banks do not replace protecting plants in nature, but they provide a backup collection.
