The Monarch Journey

- ① Every fall, monarch butterflies travel from canada to mountain forests in central Mexico. Some monarchs fly more than 2,000 miles. The insects use sunlight and Earths magnetic field to help them travel. They cannot make the whole trip in one day, so they rest on trees and drink nectar along the way during warm afternoons.
- ② In mexico, millions of butterflies cover the branches like orange leaves. The forests give the butterflies shelter from cold rain and wind but the trees need protection too. If people cut down too many trees, the butterflys may lose their winter home. Scientists and local communities work together to care for these special forests each year.
- ③ You can help monarchs in your own neighborhood. Plant native flowers, such as milkweed and asters, in a sunny spot. Milkweed is important because monarch caterpillars eat only its leaves. Do not pick caterpillars or move them from plant to plant. Watching quietly lets you see a caterpillar form a chrysalis, then a butterfly emerges about two weeks later.
