A Sunflower's Journey

- ① First, a sunflower seed rests in warm, moist soil. Water softens its coat, and a tiny root pushes downward. Soon, a shoot grows upward toward sunlight. The seedling uses food stored inside the seed until its first green leaves open. At this stage, the young plant needs light, water, and space to grow strong and healthy.
- ② Next, the plant makes more leaves. Each leaf captures sunlight and uses it to make sugar from water and carbon dioxide. This process gives the sunflower energy to build a taller stem and larger leaves. As the stem lengthens, the roots spread through the soil. They take in water and minerals that help the plant grow.
- ③ Finally, when the sunflower is mature, a flower bud opens into a large yellow bloom. Bees and other insects visit the flower and move pollen between blooms. Later, seeds form in the flower head. When the head dries, birds may eat some seeds, while people can save others to plant next year in their gardens.

4	Why would paragraph 3 not make sense before paragraph 2?	A sunflower must grow leaves, roots, and a taller stem before it can become mature, bloom, and form seeds.
