How Water Gets Clean

- ① Before water reaches homes, it often travels through a treatment plant. Workers first send river or lake water through screens. The screens catch leaves, sticks, and other large trash. Next, the water enters a tank where tiny bits of dirt can be removed. Cleaning the water matters because people need water that is safe to drink, cook with, and wash with.
- ② At the tank, workers add a substance that makes small particles stick together. These larger clumps are called floc. The floc becomes heavy and sinks to the bottom of the tank. This step is useful because workers can take away the settled clumps more easily than they could remove tiny floating particles. Clearer water then moves on to the next step.
- ③ After settling, the water passes through layers of sand, gravel, and charcoal. These filters trap smaller pieces that did not sink. Finally, a small amount of disinfectant is added to kill many harmful germs. The treated water is tested before it enters pipes leading to homes. Testing is important because it helps workers check that the cleaning steps worked and the water meets safety rules.
