Oak Notebook

- ① On a windy morning, Maya studied the oak tree near her school. She opened a field notebook and wrote what she saw: a gray squirrel, three acorns, and a narrow crack in the bark. Her teacher asked the class to make careful notes. Later, students could compare their observations and notice changes in the tree.
- ② At lunch, Maya returned with a ruler and a small paper strip. She measured the crack by placing the strip across its widest part, then marked the length. She wondered why the crack had formed. Cracks can form as a tree grows and its outer bark stretches. Maya dated her note, so she would know when she made the measurement.
- ③ One week later, rain had filled a shallow dip beside the oak. Maya found tiny tracks in the mud and sketched their shape. She did not guess which animal made them. Instead, she wrote, "Tracks are pointed at the front and about two centimeters long." Her clear words gave the class clues they could use during their next visit.
