Purple Martin Watch

- ① Purple martins are sleek birds that live in much of eastern North America during spring and summer. Their dark feathers may look blue-black in sunlight, while males can show a purple shine. They eat flying insects, including beetles and winged ants. A martin catches food in the air, using quick turns and a wide beak.
- ② To raise young, a pair chooses a protected nesting place. Purple martins once used natural holes made by woodpeckers, but many now nest in birdhouses supplied by people. Each simple birdhouse has several small rooms. A remote camera can help observers watch the entrance without climbing near the nest. This protects the habitat and lets adults feed their chicks without disturbance.
- ③ Weather can affect a martin colony. Heavy rainfall may keep insects low, so adults must search longer for food. On hot days, nestlings can become too warm inside a crowded house. Volunteers record weather, count active nests, and clean empty rooms after the birds migrate. These notes help scientists compare colonies from one season to another.
