Repairing the Park Trail

- ① After a rainy week, the park trail was muddy and unsafe. A volunteer group met near the entrance to repair it. They carried reusable gloves, wooden boards, and a map. First, they reread the safety rules. Then they carefully removed loose rocks from the walking path. Their leader explained that small repairs can prevent larger problems during future storms.
- ② At a low spot, the volunteers discovered water flowing across the trail. They used a shovel to create a shallow channel beside it. This redirecting step helped keep walkers from slipping. One student noticed that the channel looked uneven, so the team checked it again. By lunchtime, the water moved smoothly downhill, and the trail surface began to dry in the sun.
- ③ Before leaving, the group collected trash near the creek. They sorted plastic bottles into a recycling bin and placed paper signs in a dry box. The signs gave visitors a reminder: stay on the path and report unsafe places. Everyone felt proud of the helpful work. Their cleanup made the trail more welcoming for hikers, birds, and small animals.
