## COMPLETE SENTENCE

A subordinating conjunction can begin a dependent clause. A complete sentence also has an independent clause that expresses a complete thought.

While the soup simmered, Dad set the table.

## FRAGMENT

A fragment begins with a subordinating conjunction but does not include an independent clause. It leaves the thought unfinished.

Though the parade moved slowly.

| 2 | The owl hooted when the moon rose.                   | <b>COMPLETE</b> | The independent clause The owl hooted is joined to the dependent clause when the moon rose.         |
| 3 | Although Maya practiced every day.                   | <b>FRAGMENT</b> | Although begins a dependent clause, but there is no independent clause.                             |
| 4 | If the paint dries quickly, we can hang the picture. | <b>COMPLETE</b> | The dependent clause beginning with If is joined to the independent clause we can hang the picture. |
| 5 | Since the library was closed.                        | <b>FRAGMENT</b> | Since begins a dependent clause, but the sentence does not finish the thought.                      |
| 6 | After the game ended.                                | <b>FRAGMENT</b> | After begins a dependent clause, but there is no independent clause.                                |
| 7 | Before the bus arrived, we packed lunch.             | <b>COMPLETE</b> | The dependent clause beginning with Before is joined to the independent clause we packed lunch.     |
| 8 | Unless you bring a map, you may get lost.            | <b>COMPLETE</b> | The dependent clause beginning with Unless is joined to the independent clause you may get lost.    |

- **COMPLETE:** When the bell rang, students lined up.

**Challenge:** Unless the wind calms down, the sailors will stay in port.
