A comma comes after the introductory phrase or clause. It separates the opening words from the main sentence.

COMMA IS MISSING

The sentence begins with an introductory phrase or clause, but it needs a comma before the main sentence begins.

Across distant dunes travelers paused.

For PROVE IT, students should identify the introductory phrase or clause and explain whether a comma appears after it or is needed. Part 3 responses will vary, but each USED sentence should include the comma and each MISSING sentence should leave it out.
