Maya Visits a Ship Museum

- ① At the harbor museum, Maya stopped beside a model of a nineteenth-century clipper ship. A label said the vessel was sleek, with a narrow body that helped it slice through waves. Maya connected sleek to the picture's smooth, pointed shape. She guessed that sleek meant built to move quickly and smoothly, then checked a dictionary on the museum tablet. Its definition matched her guess.
- ② Another label described sailors who had to secure the cargo before a storm. It explained that they fastened crates, barrels, and coils of rope so nothing would slide across the deck. The word secure can mean safe in some situations, but these details showed Maya that it meant to fasten firmly here. She compared the meanings in a dictionary entry and chose the one that fit.
- ③ Near the exit, Maya read that the ship's voyage was perilous, or full of serious danger. A storm map showed strong winds along the route, and a list recorded damaged sails. The nearby word, the map, and the list all supported the same meaning. Maya wrote perilous in her notebook and added the dictionary guide words for the page where she found it. Those guide words helped her locate the entry quickly.

1	What does sleek mean in the first paragraph? Which details helped Maya figure it out?	Sleek means built to move quickly and smoothly. The ship's narrow body, smooth pointed shape, and ability to slice through waves are clues.
2	Which meaning of secure fits the second paragraph, safe or fasten firmly? Explain using details from the passage.	Fasten firmly fits. The sailors fastened crates, barrels, and rope so they would not slide across the deck.
3	How do the words after perilous help clarify its meaning? Name one other detail that supports that meaning.	The words "or full of serious danger" directly explain perilous. The storm map with strong winds or the list of damaged sails also supports the meaning.
4	What reference materials did Maya use, and how did each one help her?	She used a dictionary on the museum tablet to check meanings of sleek and secure. She used dictionary guide words to find the entry for perilous quickly.
