A Garden Conversation

- ① On Monday, Jada spoke to her class about a small garden planned beside the playground. “Why do we need a garden?” Mateo asked. Jada answered, “It can give bees and butterflies nectar, and students can observe living things.” She paused so classmates could think. Then she asked, “What plants might help pollinators?” Several hands rose.
- ② Lena said, “My family has extra tomato seeds.” Jada replied, “Would you be willing to bring some?” Lena nodded. Mr. Cho asked, “Who will water the garden during summer?” Jada did not know yet. Instead of guessing, she said, “That is an important question. I will ask the school office and share what I learn.” Her answer showed respect for the question.
- ③ After the talk, Nia asked, “Could the garden grow food for the cafeteria?” Jada answered, “That idea could work if the cafeteria staff agrees.” Nia followed up, “How can students help?” Jada said, “You could make plant labels, pull weeds with an adult, or record which insects visit.” Before class ended, Jada asked, “Which job would you choose, and why?” The audience discussed their choices.
