Maya's Reading Plan

- ① On Monday, Maya opened her library book, a mystery about a missing map. The first chapter felt confusing because it introduced many characters. Instead of waiting for her teacher to explain it, Maya reread the page and wrote the characters' names on a sticky note. She also set a goal to finish two chapters before dinner.
- ② On Tuesday, Maya noticed that she had stopped often to look up unfamiliar words. She decided to use the glossary at the back of the book before using a dictionary. This choice helped her keep reading without losing the story. At the end of the chapter, she checked her sticky note and added one new character.
- ③ By Friday, Maya had finished the book. Her prediction about the map was wrong, but she was glad she had recorded it because she could see how her thinking changed. For her next mystery, Maya planned to make a character list sooner and pause after each chapter to write one question. She chose these steps because they matched what she needed as a reader.
