From Scraps to Soil

- ① At Maple Street Garden, students turn food scraps into compost, a dark material that helps soil. First, they add fruit peels, vegetable bits, dry leaves, and shredded paper to a bin. These materials are called organic matter because they came from living things. The students avoid meat, oil, and dairy foods, which can smell bad and attract animals.
- ② Next, tiny living things such as bacteria and fungi feed on the organic matter. They need air and water to work well, so students mix the pile with a garden fork and add water when it feels dry. Mixing also spreads the materials around. As the tiny living things work, they release heat, and the center of the pile becomes warm.
- ③ After several weeks or months, much of the original material breaks down. The pile shrinks, cools, and looks more like crumbly soil than like food scraps or leaves. Students can spread the finished compost around plants. It helps soil hold water and provides nutrients that plants use to grow. The change happens faster when the pile has the right balance of wet and dry materials.
