A Filling Station for Lunch

- ① Our school has one water fountain near the gym, but many students eat lunch on the far side of the building. During lunch, a long line often forms at the fountain. Students sometimes leave the line without a drink because recess is about to start. The student council is asking the principal to decide whether to add a water bottle filling station near the cafeteria.
- ② A filling station would help students get water quickly. The cafeteria is used by students from every grade, so its hallway is a convenient location. At a student council count last Tuesday, 28 students waited at the gym fountain during one lunch period. A second station could shorten that line and give students more time to eat, drink, and get ready for recess.
- ③ Adding a station also supports good habits. Drinking water can help people stay hydrated, especially after active play. The school already has a water line near the cafeteria, according to the building manager, so installation may be simpler than adding a line in another area. The student council recommends choosing the cafeteria hallway and asking the principal to review the cost this month.

4	How does the student council's count of students waiting in line help influence the principal's decision?	It provides specific evidence that the gym fountain has a long lunch line and that another station could help.

Please add a shaded bench near the playground. At dismissal, many students wait there in the hot sun, so a bench with shade would give them a safer, more comfortable place to wait. Also, the empty space beside the fence is close to the playground, so students could reach the bench without crossing the parking lot.
