A City Falcon's Hunt

- ① On a tall city bridge, a peregrine falcon watches pigeons below. Its blue-gray back blends with the steel and sky, while dark stripes mark its pale face. The bird stays still, turning its head to track movement. Peregrine falcons often live near cliffs, but some use skyscrapers and bridges as high places for nesting and hunting.
- ② When it spots prey, the falcon begins a fast dive called a stoop. It folds its wings close to its body, which helps it cut through the air. During a stoop, the falcon may reach more than 200 miles per hour. Just before contact, it adjusts its path and strikes with its feet, called talons.
- ③ After a successful hunt, the falcon carries food to a safe perch or nest site. Parents tear prey into small pieces for young chicks, which cannot hunt yet. City nesting pairs can help control some pigeon populations, although they do not remove all pigeons. By using tall human-made structures, peregrine falcons show how a wild animal can survive in a busy city.
