Growing a Coral Reef

- ① On a reef near Florida, scientists are helping young corals grow. A coral nursery is an underwater place where small coral pieces are cared for before they are moved to a damaged reef. Divers attach the pieces to underwater frames. The frames hold the corals in sunlight and moving water, where they can grow stronger.
- ② Before placement, workers inspect each coral for disease. They record observations, or careful notes about what they see, in a field journal. This data helps the team compare growth over time. If one group grows slowly, the scientists can investigate possible causes, such as warmer water or too much sediment, loose material that can cloud the water and settle on corals.
- ③ After several months, divers transplant some corals, moving them from the nursery to bare areas of the reef. The prefix trans- means across or from one place to another. Scientists monitor the transplanted corals regularly. To monitor means to check something carefully over time. Their results show whether the restoration plan is working as expected.

1	What does nursery mean in paragraph 1? Name one detail that helped you determine its meaning.	A nursery is an underwater place where small coral pieces are cared for before being moved. The sentence explains that the pieces are cared for there before they go to a damaged reef.
2	What does observations mean in paragraph 2? Which words in the sentence give you the clue?	Observations means careful notes about what workers see. The clue words are "careful notes about what they see."
3	What does sediment mean in paragraph 2? Use the context clues to explain it.	Sediment is loose material in the water that can cloud the water and settle on corals.
4	Use the prefix trans- and the sentence around it to explain what transplant means in paragraph 3.	Transplant means to move corals from one place to another, from the nursery to bare areas of the reef.
