Maya Revises an Announcement

- ① On Monday, Maya wrote a short announcement asking classmates to join the school garden club. Her first draft began, “Gardens are nice. We need helpers.” It listed meeting times before explaining what the club would do. Maya reread it and noticed that readers might not know why the garden mattered. She also thought the word nice did not show the garden’s value.
- ② Two classmates gave feedback. Jordan said the announcement should open with the club’s purpose, so busy readers would understand it quickly. Lina asked Maya to add a fact about the garden. Maya checked the science teacher’s records and learned that students had harvested 86 pounds of vegetables last spring. Lina also suggested replacing the plain ending, “Come help,” with words that created a picture.
- ③ Maya moved the purpose to the beginning and added the harvest fact after it. Her revised announcement said, “Join the garden club to grow fresh food for our school. Last spring, students harvested 86 pounds of vegetables. We meet Tuesdays at 3:15 in the garden shed. Dig in with us, and help turn tiny seeds into crunchy lunches.” The new order explained the goal, supported it with information, and ended with a lively image.

4	Explain how the revised announcement is more effective than the first draft. Use two changes from the passage.	It states the purpose first and adds a specific harvest fact. It also ends with a lively image that makes joining sound interesting.
