A Monarch's Long Journey

- ① Monarch butterflies are easy to notice because their orange wings have black lines and white spots. In late summer and fall, many eastern monarchs begin a long trip south. Some travel from the United States and Canada to mountain forests in central Mexico. This migration can cover thousands of miles during a single season (National Geographic Society).
- ② To prepare, a monarch drinks nectar from flowers and stores fat for the journey. The butterfly uses the sun and Earth's magnetic field to help it travel in the right direction. At night, thousands may rest together in trees, which helps them stay warmer. Scientists are still studying exactly how monarchs navigate so well (U.S. Forest Service).
- ③ People can help monarchs by planting native milkweed and nectar flowers. Milkweed is important because monarch caterpillars eat its leaves. Gardeners should choose plants that are native to their area and avoid spraying insecticides where butterflies feed. Small habitat spaces can provide food and shelter during migration (Xerces Society). These choices support butterflies and other pollinators.
