Rain Gardens at Work

- ① City planners are adding rain gardens beside some streets. These shallow planted areas catch rainwater, and their roots help water soak into the ground. As a result, less water rushes into storm drains during heavy rain. Rain gardens also provide flowers and shelter for insects, so they can make a neighborhood look brighter while helping local waterways.
- ② In contrast, a typical storm drain moves water away quickly through pipes. This system is useful during a sudden downpour, but it usually does not clean the water as it travels. Rain gardens work more slowly. Similarly, both rain gardens and storm drains are designed to reduce puddles on roads and sidewalks after a storm in busy areas.
- ③ Residents can help these gardens stay healthy. For example, volunteers may pull weeds and replace dead plants in spring. However, they should not add lawn chemicals nearby, because rain can carry those chemicals into the garden. Consequently, a cared-for rain garden can continue filtering runoff and supporting insects for many years in a nearby neighborhood.
