- **SEMICOLONS:** The camp hired Eli Grant, a medic; Rosa Lee, a canoe guide; and Theo Park, a cook.
- **COMMAS:** The artist used blue, silver, and white paint.

Challenge: Visitors toured Madison, Wisconsin; Mobile, Alabama; Eugene, Oregon; and Dover, Delaware.

For Part 2, students should state that semicolons are needed when at least one list item has an internal comma, while commas work when no list item has one. Accept original examples when the punctuation matches the category accurately.
